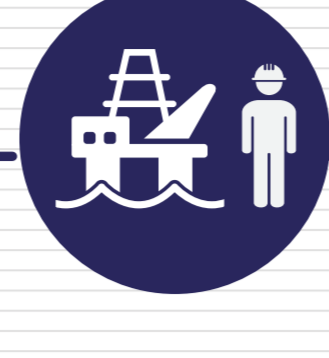

QUALITY OF LIFE: OFFSHORE EMPLOYEE EXPECTATIONS

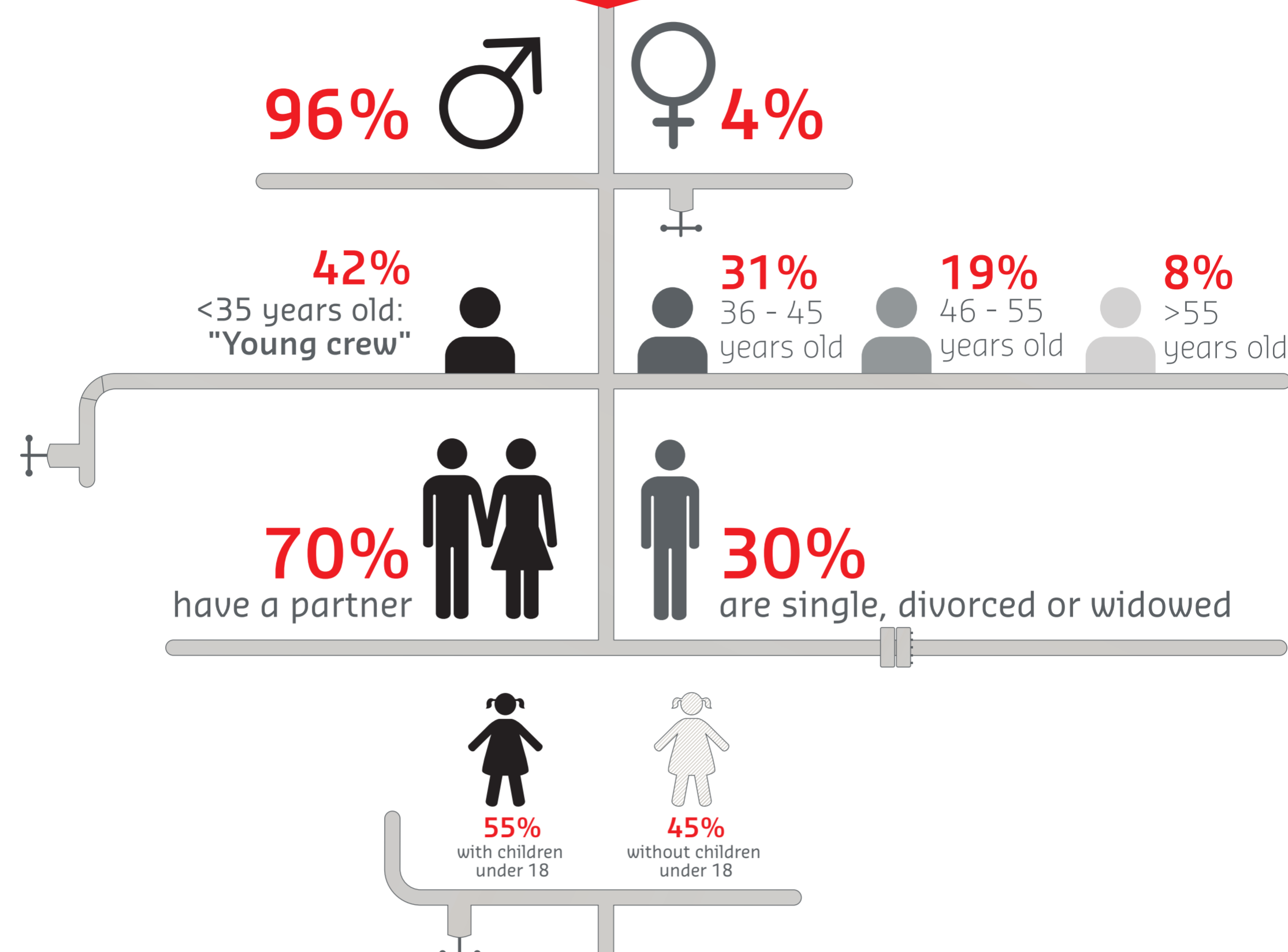

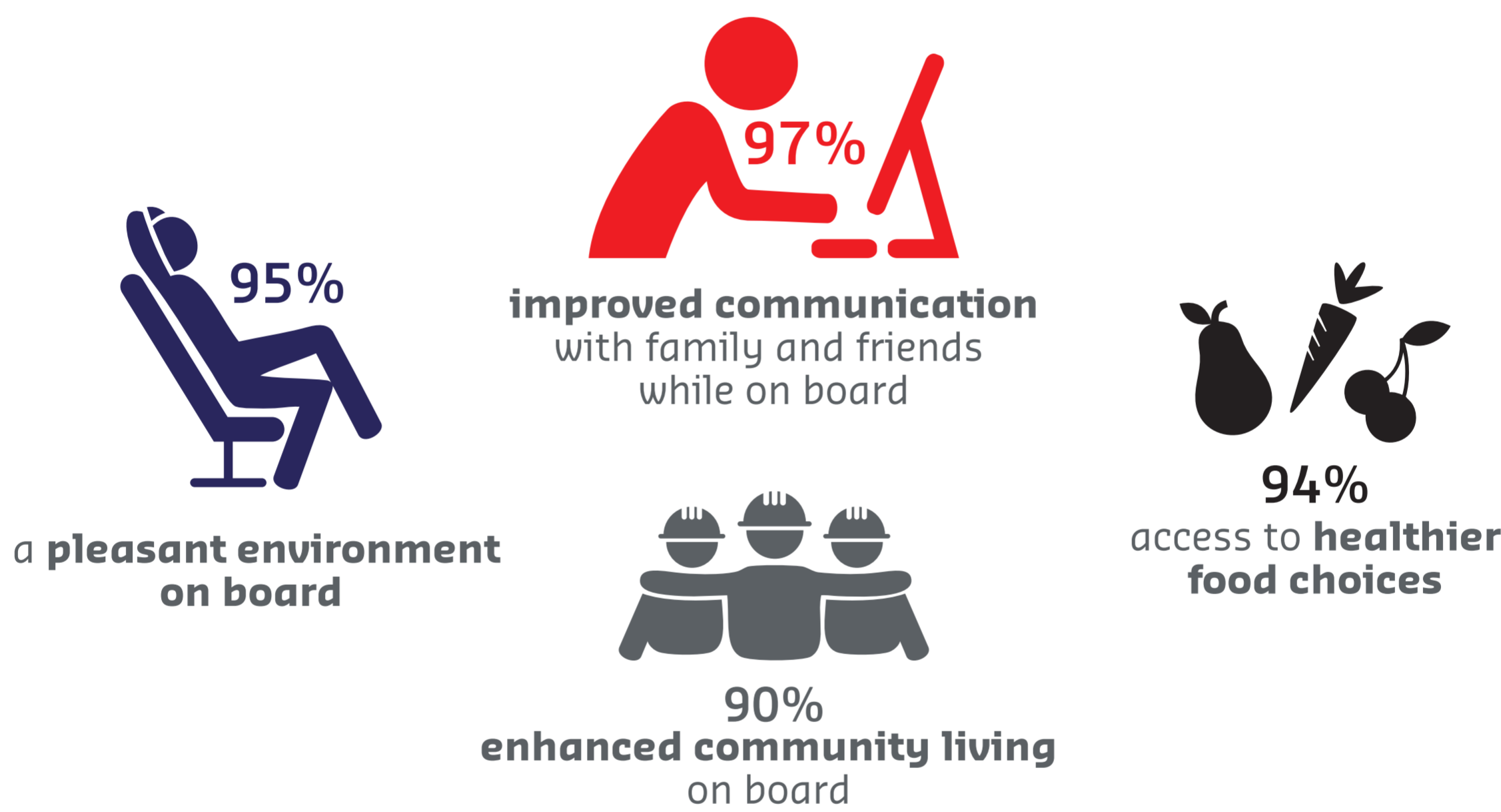

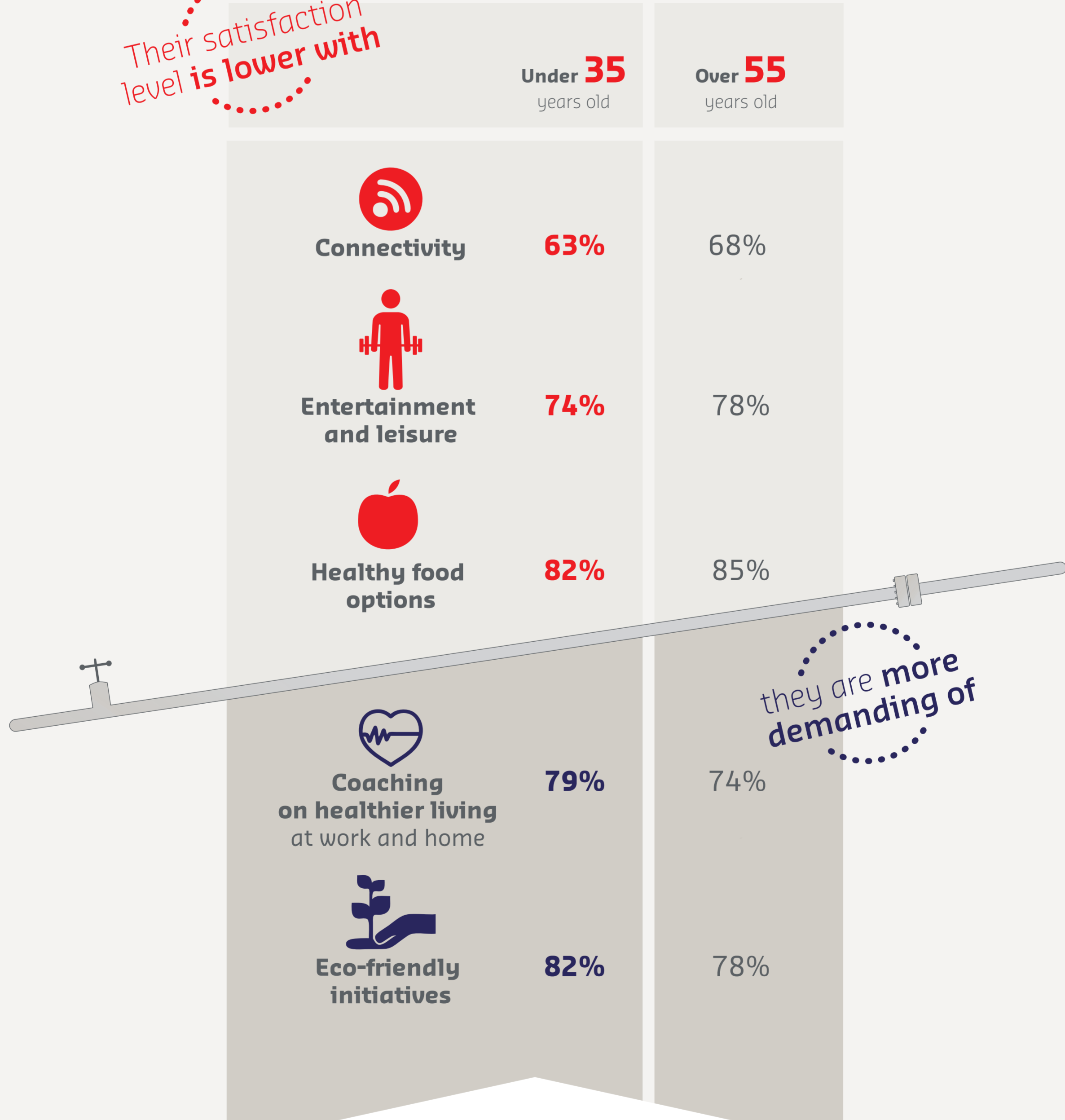


WHAT ARE THEIR EXPECTATIONS IN TERMS OF QUALITY OF LIFE?

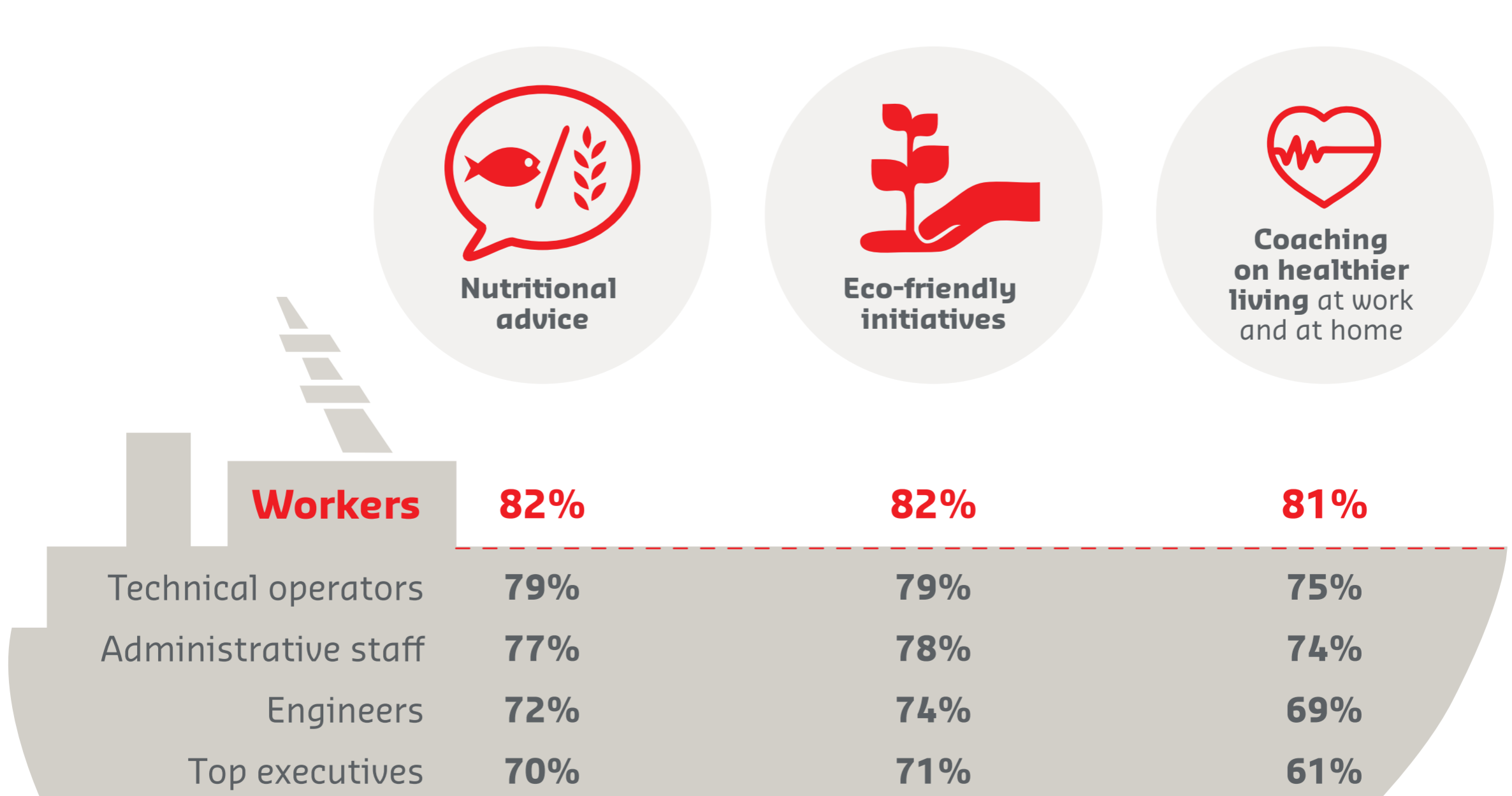


THE "YOUNG CREW" HAS MORE EXPECTATIONS
